Workforce Development

Training Specialist/Recruiter/Staff Development

Use knowledge of curriculum planning and learning to develop and train professional employees.

Conference Development/Education Consultant

Lead professional development on a large scale and improve educational settings.

Internship Manager

Create learning opportunities for high school and college students in professional settings. We recommend students complete a dual focus in Diversity and Social Justice.

Diversity and Social Justice

Policy Analyst/Lobbyist/Advocate Use knowledge of educational systems to evaluate existing policies and advocate for changes. We recommend students complete a dual focus in Workforce Development.

College Admissions/Recruiter Help transition potential students to college settings.

Youth Case Manager

Support youth in the community with balancing academics, home life, and planning for future. We recommend students complete a dual focus in Youth, Family, and Community.

Youth, Family, and Community

Community Education Coordinator Develop and maintain education programs in museums, zoos, or other community settings.

Educational Non-Profit

Create extra-curricular educational support for youth through non-profit management and development.

Tutor/Test Preparation

Augment classroom learning and prepare high school students for pre-college testing. We recommend students complete a dual focus in Workforce Development.
