# TRANSFER PATHWAY GUIDE 2024-2025

Associate of Arts in Liberal Arts at UC Clermont College to a Bachelor of Arts in Anthropology at Northern Kentucky University

#### Overview

Completion of the following curriculum will satisfy the requirements for the Associate of Arts (AA) in Liberal Arts degree at UC Clermont College and leads to the Bachelor of Arts (BA) in Anthropology degree at Northern Kentucky University (NKU).

#### Degree Requirements for UC Clermont

To earn a degree at UC Clermont, a student must complete a minimum of 61 credit hours, attain a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.0, and earn a minimum of 20 credit hours at the institution awarding the degree.

#### Admission Requirements for NKU

Students completing an associate degree with a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher will be accepted into NKU.

#### **Degree Requirements for NKU**

To earn a bachelor's degree at NKU, students must complete a minimum of 120 credit hours with at least 45 credit hours numbered 300 and above. In addition, at least 25% of the credit hours required for the degree and the last 30 credit hours must be completed at NKU. Students must have minimum 2.0 GPA for courses counted toward the major and an overall GPA of 2.0. At least one 300 level course must be taken from each of the categories of archaeological anthropology, biological anthropology and cultural anthropology. Students must complete a focus or minor as indicated on the pathway.
